RADIATION HEALTH AND SAFETY ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Radiation Health and Safety Advisory Council is an advisory body established under the *Australian Radiation Protection and Nuclear Safety Act 1998*. The role of the Council is to identify emerging issues relating to radiation protection and nuclear safety, including matters of major concern to the community, and to advise the CEO of the Australian Radiation Protection and Nuclear Safety Agency on those matters.

Members of Council are part-time appointments for a period of up to three years, made by the Assistant Minister for Rural Health following consultation with the CEO of ARPANSA. The current term of two Council members expires on 31 March 2017. Members receive sitting fees, as determined by the Remuneration Tribunal.
